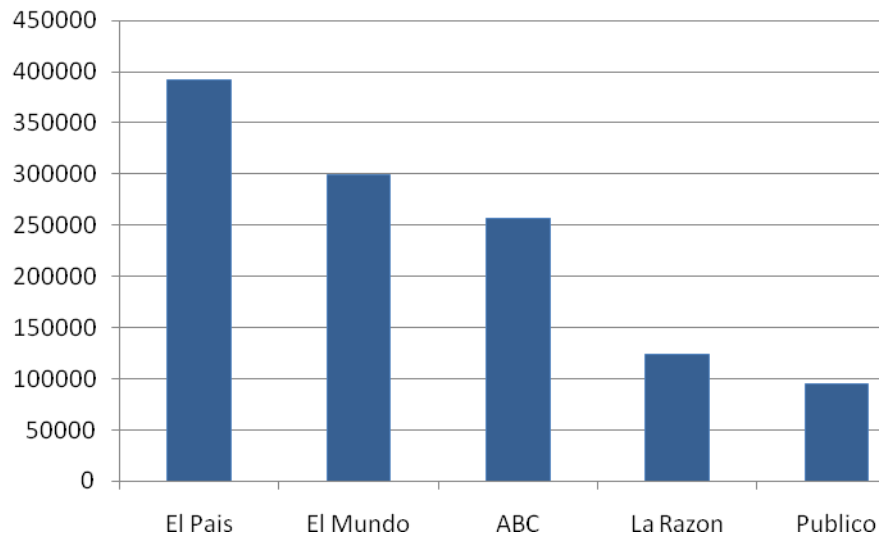
This presentation includes some information about the discourse of *El Pais* on the issue of Greek economic crisis during the period September 2009 – April 2010. This period covers the six months that preceded Athens’ request (on April 23) for the activation of the EU-IMF rescue package.

The research conducted here is part of a broader research project entitled ‘The Greek Economic Crisis in the International Press’. This broader research covers the analysis of newspapers from ten different countries: China Daily (China), Die Zeit (Germany), El Pais (Spain), Le Figaro (France), The Korea Times (Korea), The New York Times (USA), The Straits Times (Singapore), The Times of India (India), The Times (UK).

The findings presented here cover only the first phase of the research project ‘The Greek Economic Crisis in the International Press’. The second phase of this project, which is currently underway, covers the analysis of the six months that followed the activation of the EU-IMF rescue package (i.e. May – October 2010). The findings of this second phase will be published in Summer 2011.

This brief presentation refers only to some of the main findings of the analysis of the discourse of El Pais. The full report is only available in Greek and can be downloaded from IDIS’ website.

Table 2. Number of Articles with Reference to Greece in their Title

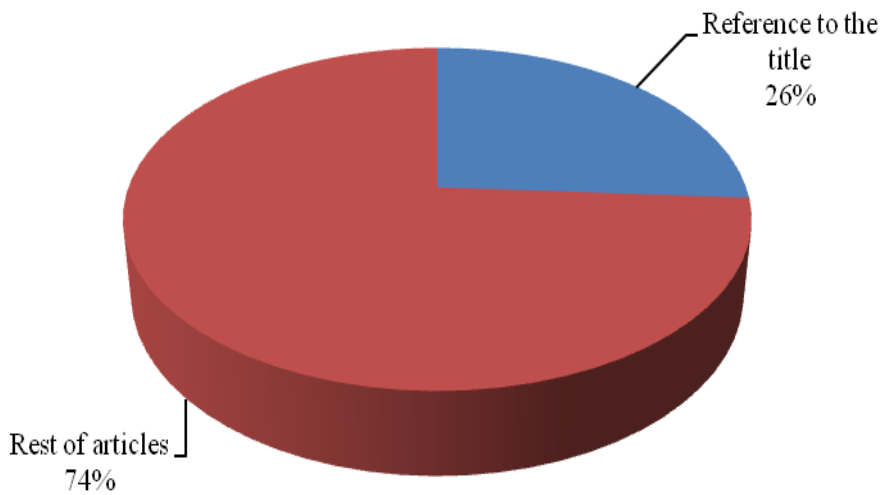


Table 3. Number of Articles in El Pais with Reference to the Greek Political and Economic Situation

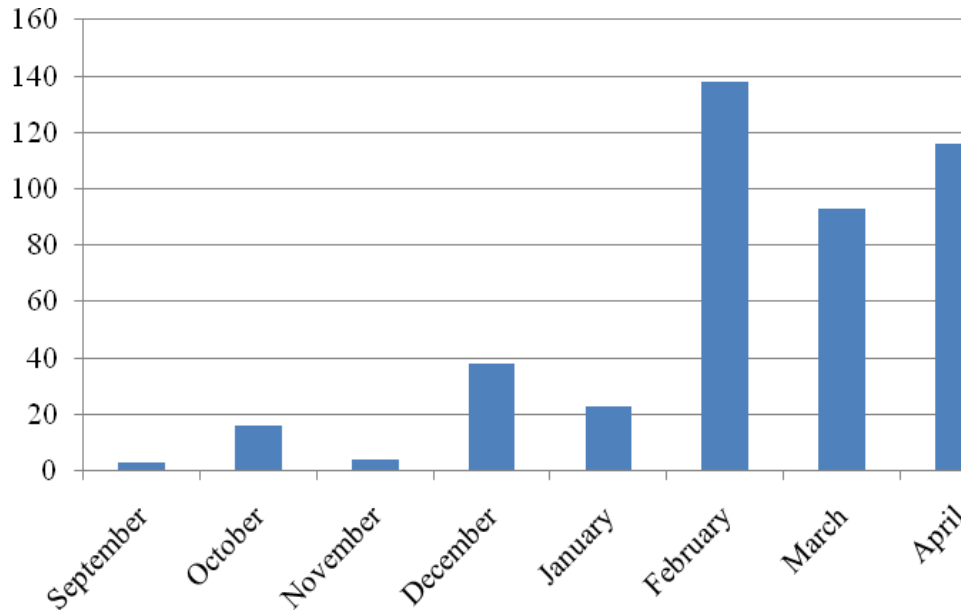


Table 4. The Greek Crisis in the Front Page of El Pais

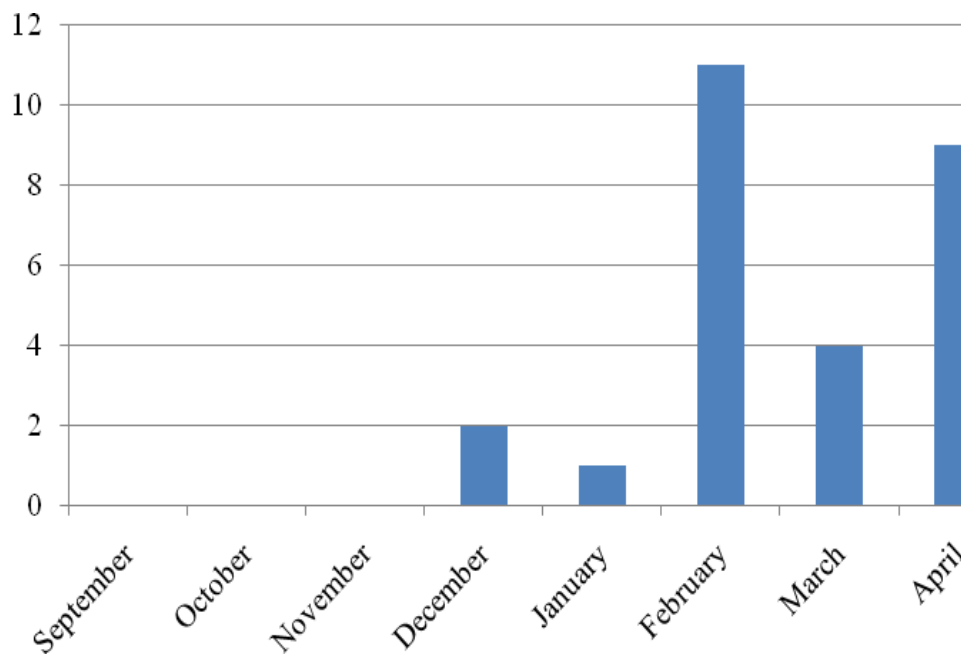


Table 5. The Frame of Analysis of the Greek Economic Crisis in *El Pais*

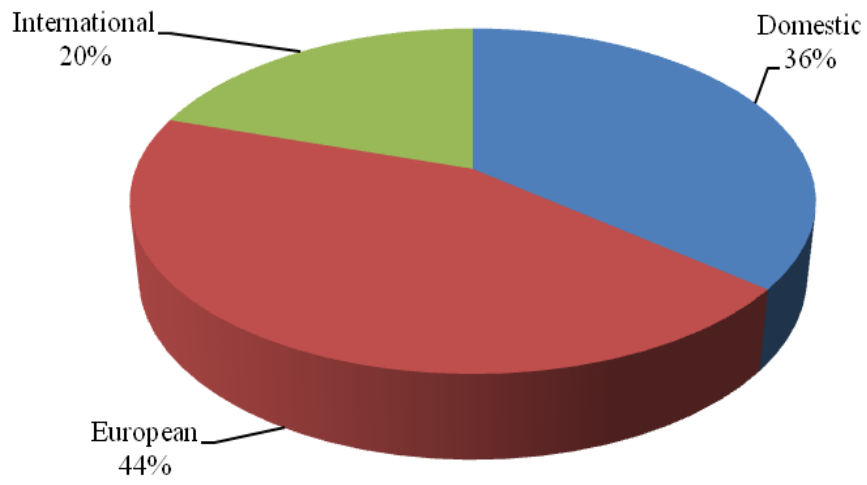


Table 6. *El Pais* stance towards Greece

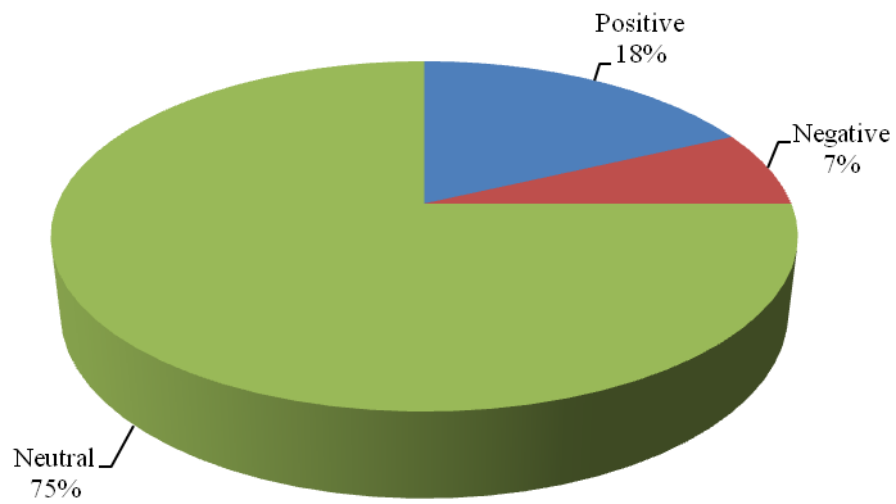


Table 7. References in each sector of El Pais newspaper regarding the Greek Issue (% of total articles)

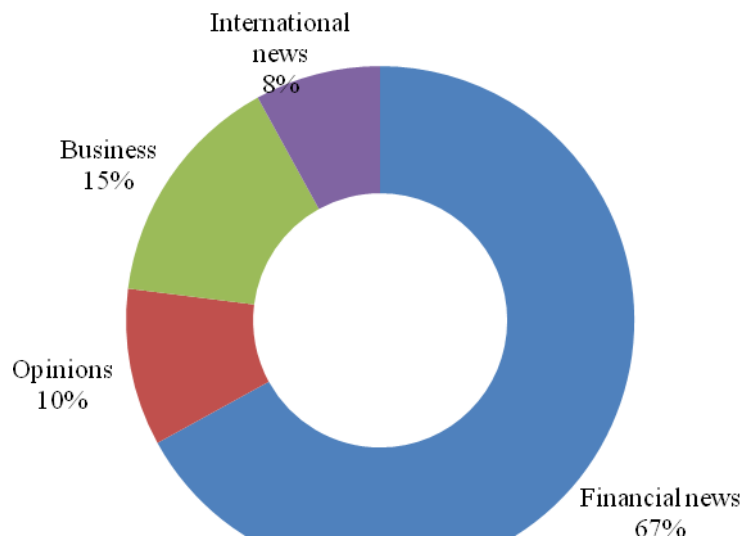


Table 8. Issues/themes that dominate in the El Pais discourse on the Greek economic crisis

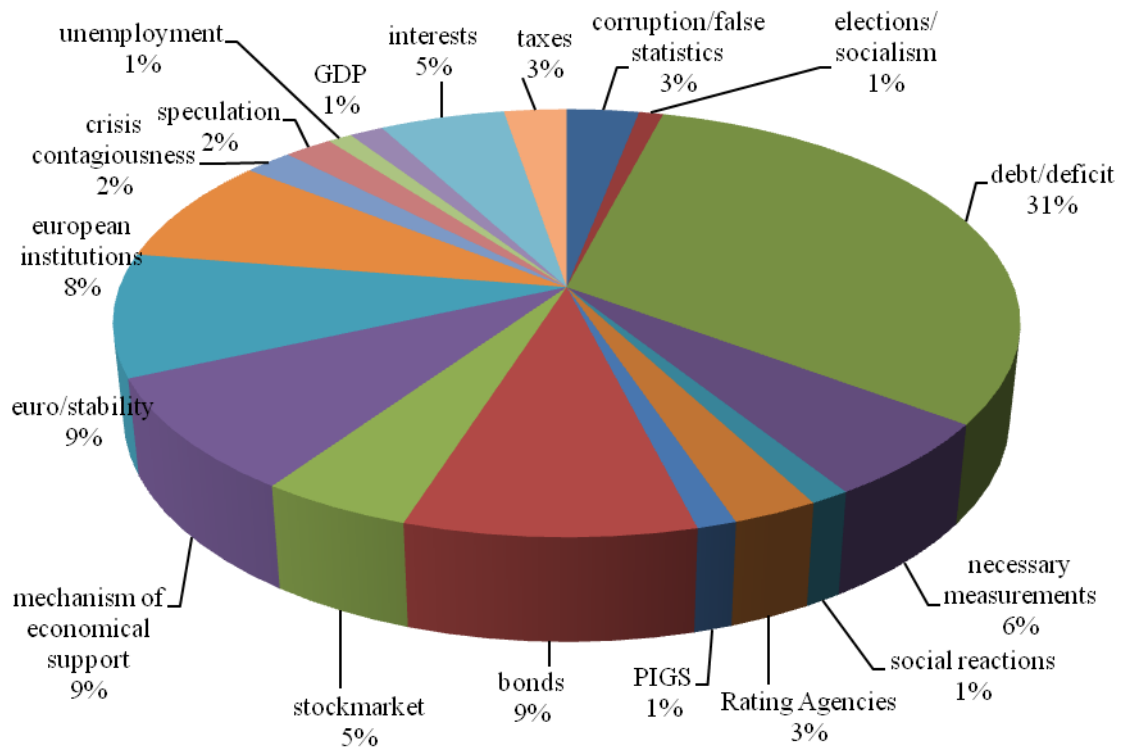


Table 9. Indicative Negative References to Greece that Dominate in El Pais's discourse
